## GRADE 1 CURRICULUM – ENGLISH GRAMMAR & PUNCTUATION

### Unit 1 – Weekend Fun!

**Grammar Concept:** Nouns name people, places, animals, and things

**Punctuation Concept:** A sentence ends with a period, a question mark, or an exclamation point

### Unit 2 – The Five Senses

**Grammar Concept:** Adjectives describe nouns

**Punctuation Concept:** Some abbreviations of personal titles end with a period

### Unit 3 – School

**Grammar Concept:** Verbs describe the action in a sentence

**Punctuation Concept:** An apostrophe replaces a letter or letters so that two words can be joined to form a contraction

### Unit 4 – Birthday Party

**Grammar Concept:** Pronouns can replace and function as nouns

**Punctuation Concept:** A colon separates the hour and minutes in written time

### Unit 5 – Sports

**Grammar Concept:** Proper nouns name specific people, places, animals and things and are capitalized

**Punctuation Concept:** Commas are used after the greetings and closings of friendly letters

### Unit 6 – On the Move

**Grammar Concept:** Singular nouns refer to one person, place, animal or thing while plural nouns refer to more than one

**Punctuation Concept:** Commas are used in dates to separate the day from the year

### Unit 7 – Food

**Grammar Concept:** A verb's form must agree with the subject in number

**Punctuation Concept:** Commas are used to separate items in a series

### Unit 8 – Animals

**Grammar Concept:** A complete sentence has a subject and a predicate

**Punctuation Concept:** Title of books and movies that are written must be underlined

### Unit 9 – Family

**Grammar Concept:** Possessive nouns indicate ownership and can be singular or plural

**Punctuation Concept:** Apostrophes are used in all possessive nouns and an apostrophe's placement can indicate whether a possessive noun is singular or plural

### **Unit 10 – At the Park**

**Grammar Concept:** Prepositions can indicate where nouns are located in relation to other nouns

**Punctuation Concept:** An abbreviation of a street name ends with a period

### **Unit 11 – Go and See**

**Grammar Concept:** Irregular plural nouns have specific spellings that do not follow a standard rule

**Punctuation Concept:** Commas separate the different elements of an address

### **Unit 12 – The Four Seasons**

**Grammar Concept:** Verb tenses indicate the time of an action or state

**Punctuation Concept:** Abbreviations of month names end with a period

### **Unit 13 – With My Friends**

**Grammar Concept:** Comparative adjectives compare two nouns and superlative adjectives compare three or more nouns

**Punctuation Concept:** An abbreviation of a day of the week ends with a period

### **Unit 14 – Bugs and Insects**

**Grammar Concept:** Articles precede nouns

**Punctuation Concept:** Commas set apart words *yes* and *no* in sentences

### **Unit 15 – Pets People Have**

**Grammar Concept:** Avoid using double negatives in writing

**Punctuation Concept:** Sentences begin with capital letters
