GRADE 2 CURRICULUM – ENGLISH GRAMMAR & PRONUNCIATION

Unit 1 – At the Beach

Grammar Concept: Singular nouns name one person, place, animal, or thing, and plural nouns name more than one noun

Punctuation Concept: A sentence ends with a period a question mark, or an exclamation point

Unit 2 – All About Living Things

Grammar Concept: Irregular plural nouns have specific spellings that do not follow a standard rule

Punctuation Concept: Colons separate the hours from the minutes in written time.

Unit 3 – Family

Grammar Concept: Adjectives describe nouns

Punctuation Concept: An apostrophe replaces a letter or letters so that two words can be joined to form a contraction

Unit 4 – At the Park

Grammar Concept: Verbs describe the action in a sentence

Punctuation Concept: Commas are used after the greetings and closings of friendly letters

Unit 5 – All About Astronauts

Grammar Concept: Personal pronouns can replace and function as nouns.

Punctuation Concept: An Apostrophes are used in all possessive nouns and an apostrophe's placement can indicate whether a possessive noun is singular or plural.

Unit 6 – Sleepover

Grammar Concept: Comparative adjectives compare two nouns, and superlative adjective compare three or more nouns.

Punctuation Concept: Commas separate the different elements of an address.

Unit 7 – Bugs

Grammar Concept: Adverbs tell more about how, where, or when an action happens.

Punctuation Concept: Certain words in a sentence begin with a capital letter.

Unit 8 – Travel

Grammar Concept: Verb tenses indicate whether an action happened in the past, present or future.

Punctuation Concept: Titles of books, movies, and television shows are italicized or underlined.

Unit 9 – At the Library

Grammar Concept: Some past tense verbs have irregular spellings that must be memorized.

Punctuation Concept: Question marks are used around titles of songs and poems.

Unit 10 – Birthday Party

Grammar Concept: A preposition indicates a relationship between a noun or pronoun and another word in the sentence.

Punctuation Concept: A comma separates the day from the year in a date.

Unit 11 – Keeping Busy

Grammar Concept: Relative pronouns are used when the subject and object are the same person or thing.

Punctuation Concept: Commas separate items in a series.

Unit 12 – At the Parade

Grammar Concept: Collective nouns name groups of people and things

Punctuation Concept: A period is used after the abbreviation of a street name.

Unit 13 – All About Animals

Grammar Concept: A verb must agree with its subject in number.

Punctuation Concept: Commas are used to set off the words yes and no from the rest of the sentence.

Unit 14 – Doing a Project

Grammar Concept: a complete sentence has a subject and a predicate.

Punctuation Concept: Some abbreviations of personal titles end with a period.

Unit 15 – At the Store

Grammar Concept: A compound sentence has two or more independent clauses joined by a coordinating conjunction..

Punctuation Concept: A compound sentence has a comma before the coordinating conjunction that separates the two independent clauses.
